Our program can offer LLM students one form of institutional financial assistance, which are the Dean's Tuition Fellowships. These limited, competitive fellowships are awarded based on merit and financial circumstances, and will be assessed towards tuition fees – they cannot be applied towards living expenses. Award amounts typically fall between 20% and 30% of the cost of tuition; the fellowship cannot cover the full cost of tuition, and in the majority of cases, recipients will obtain a between 10% and 40% of tuition fees. Consideration for the award is based on factors relating to both merit – academic and professional achievement – and financial circumstances or need.

All LL.M. applicants (both American and foreign-educated law graduates) are eligible for consideration.

Due to the competitive nature of these fellowships, we cannot guarantee that all applicants will receive the Dean's Tuition Fellowship if granted admission.
